



Caldicott's Governing Council

Caldicott Trust Ltd is a charitable educational trust which is overseen by and answers to Companies House and the Charity Commission. Its Governing Council comprises a minimum of eight and maximum of 14 governors, each of who acts as a Trustee and Company Director. Governors hold office for a five-year term whereupon they may be reappointed. They are all volunteers and very generously give their time and expertise gratis. Their short biographies are listed below.

The Council meets collectively at least three times each year with substantial work completed between meetings through a range of Governor-led sub-committees each of which is focussed on a particular area of importance to the school. Additionally, they visit the School frequently and assist with a wide range of core activities and business.

Malcolm Swift

Malcolm joined Caldicott's governing body in 2010 and was Chair of the Finance Committee before becoming Chair of the Council in 2014.
